Expulsion Required

Any student who brings a dangerous weapon to school, or to any school related activity, or who possesses a dangerous weapon while traveling to or from school or any school related activity shall be permanently expelled.

Any student who commits criminal sexual conduct in a school building or on school grounds, or who commits arson in a school building or on school grounds shall be permanently expelled.

Any student who pleads to, is convicted of, or is adjudicated for criminal sexual conduct against another pupil enrolled in the District, shall be permanently expelled.

Any student, grade six or above, who commits a physical assault at school against a school employee, volunteer, or contractor shall be permanently expelled.

Any student, grade six or above, who commits a verbal assault at school against a school employee, volunteer, or contractor shall be disciplined for a period of time as determined by the Board or Superintendent.

Any student, grade six or above, who makes a bomb threat or similar threat directed against school property or persons shall be disciplined for a period of time as determined by the Board or Superintendent.

Any student, grade six or above, who commits a physical assault at school against another student shall be expelled for up to 180 school days.

Before imposing a suspension or expulsion, the factors set forth in Section 1310d of the School Code, MCL 380.1310d, must be considered and a lesser penalty may be imposed. This requirement does not apply to possession of a firearm.

Not a Limitation

This policy is designed to implement specific requirements of State law and is not intended as a limitation on the jurisdiction of the district over student conduct. Students may be disciplined for conduct that does not meet the definitions in this policy so long as the conduct is otherwise described in the Student Code of Conduct and the student is under the jurisdiction of the district as described in Policy JC.

Definitions

"Dangerous Weapon" means a firearm, dagger, dirk, stiletto, knife with a blade over three inches in length, pocket knife opened by a mechanical device, iron bar, or brass knuckles, and includes a "firearm" as that term is defined in Section 921 of Title 18 of the U.S. Code.

"At School" means in a classroom, elsewhere on school premises, on a school bus or other school related vehicle, or at a school sponsored activity or event whether or not it is held on school premises.

"Physical Assault" means intentionally causing or attempting to cause physical harm to another through force or violence.

"Verbal Assault" means any threat to injure another person under circumstances that lead the person to fear imminent injury, combined with the apparent ability to inflict injury.

Readmission

A student permanently expelled under this policy may apply for readmission as provided by Sections 1311 and 1311a of the School Code, MCL 380.1300 and 380.1311a. A student who has been permanently expelled by another Michigan school district may only be admitted after following procedures of Sections 1311 and 1311a of the School Code. A student who has been expelled by another Michigan school district for a bomb threat, verbal assault, or physical assault on a student shall not be admitted until the term of the expulsion has expired.

If the weapon involved is a "firearm" as that term is defined in Section 921 of Title 18 of the U.S. Code, the student shall not be eligible to apply for readmission to school for a minimum of one year from the date of expulsion unless the Superintendent finds that there are special circumstances.

Permanent Record

Any expulsion under this policy shall be entered on the student's permanent record.

Referral

Within three school days after the expulsion, the Superintendent shall refer the student to the Macomb County Family Independence Agency, or a county community mental health agency. Referral includes notification to the parent or guardian, or to the student if over age eighteen.

Due Process

The expulsion shall be processed through the regular discipline procedures applicable to other offenses. Students eligible for special education services, or Section 504 accommodations, may only be expelled in conformity with the applicable statutes and regulations.

In the enforcement of this policy, principals may authorize:

1. Unannounced inspections of student desks and lockers;
2. Inspections of student automobiles driven to school; and
3. Inspections of the contents of pockets and/or purses if suspected of being in possession of prohibited, stolen, or illegal items.

In the event of a violation of this policy, the following steps will be followed:

1. Teachers/staff should notify the administration immediately.
2. Principals should immediately notify the police.

3. Principals should attempt to notify the staff and take whatever steps are necessary to provide for the safety of students and staff.
4. Parent of student with weapons must be notified.
5. The Superintendent must be notified.
6. The Crisis Team may be convened.
7. Discipline will be evoked based upon the Code of Conduct.
8. Each school will undertake activities designed to develop a school-wide acceptance of desirable behavior standards particularly as they relate to weapons.
9. Hopefully, all students will feel a school citizenship responsibility to report violations of weapons regulations.
10. Schools are encouraged to use special student committees to help establish a climate of responsible behavior at all interscholastic events - particularly athletics.
