Mrs. Reece unselfishly offers tutoring to any student who seeks help with their instrument or voice. She further encourages her students to excel by scheduling after school vocal rehearsals and instrumental practice sessions. Moreover, she has consistently invited guest artists, conductors, and musicians to her classes to enrich her students understanding of music and cultivate their musicality. She looks forward to the visiting guest conductors and musicians providing a critique of her conducting and teaching, while also seeking feedback and ratings on the student performances. In addition, Danielle works closely with her network of band directors, seeking additional feedback to enhance her teaching.

Mrs. Reece demonstrates the perfect combination of high expectations and understanding of her students to produce successful band and choral ensembles. This is evident through the high number of students who receive excellent ratings in the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association Band Festival performances and then continue with their musical endeavors in high school. Actively engaging students not only leads to outstanding performances, but to minimal disciplinary issues.
