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The staff at Eastland Middle School has created a summer learning packet to help students maintain their skill set. The packet will cover four subject areas; predominantly math, however it will also have English, science, and social studies. The packet will be broken into subject areas and a general timeframe of completion for each section is below:

ELA=read the book throughout the summer and answer questions as you're reading

Math=July 7, 2017

Science=July 21, 2017

Social Studies=August 4, 2017

The completion of this packet is important, so each section will count as your child's first summative grade (test grade) in that subject area. We will add the entire packet to the Eastland Middle School website in case replacement pages are needed.

Letters will also be going out to those students who did not meet the criteria to be promoted to the next grade. Roseville Community Schools is offering summer school for credit recovery at Roseville High School and the cost is \$75 per session for Roseville residents and \$150 for non-residents. Compared to surrounding districts this is very reasonable. Attending will help prepare students for success next year and will still allow students plenty of time off over the summer. If any parent has questions regarding summer school, please contact the Counseling Office.

Finally, I would like to give a special thank you to Tina Coury-Pietrykowski, Natascha Goerke-Fontana, our parent club officers, and Rose Kuechenmeister, an EMS staff member and longtime active member of the RCS community, and Casey Patterson, an EMS parent, for all of the hard work they did for all of the students at EMS this year. Their fundraising efforts for student incentives, involvement in after school activities, and commitment to all of the children at EMS played a significant role in the success we had this school year. 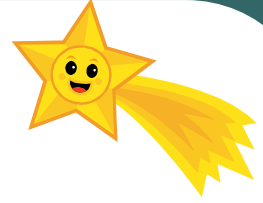
