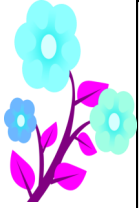

SUGGESTED SUPPLY LIST

2018/2019

The basic classroom supplies and materials needed by students will be provided by the school. If your child would like to have his or her own supplies (crayons, pencils, notebooks, etc.), you are welcome to send them.

We encourage you to label all personal supplies with your child's name.

Elementary teachers have also offered a list (to be sent home with report cards) of suggested items that may be useful in their particular classrooms. In addition, teachers will be happy to accept donations of certain supplies for general classroom use. Examples: sanitizing hand wipes, facial tissue, paper towels, Ziploc bags, etc.

BOND INFORMATION

Dear Fountain Elementary School Parents:

The Roseville Community Schools Board of Education has unanimously approved placing a comprehensive \$59.4 million bond proposal on the May 8 ballot. Prior to the Board of Education's vote, the Michigan Department of Treasury reviewed and approved more than 200 projects that are included in the bond proposal.

To prepare the bond proposal, the Roseville Community School District conducted a school district assessment, developed a list of priority projects, and reviewed the project list with more than 400 residents and community leaders in a series of seven public meetings. Roseville Community Schools Superintendent John Kment said, "The bond proposal will affect every Roseville student and every Roseville school facility. The emphasis will be on updating instructional technology and infrastructure, enhancing school security and student safety, replacing band instruments, upgrading athletic fields, playgrounds, and parking lots, and replacing school buses that have reached the end of their useful life."

If approved by voters, here are the projects scheduled for Fountain Elementary School, the middle schools, Roseville High School, and District Wide:

Upgrade network and wireless access

Replace student and staff computers and mobile devices

Replace interactive classroom audio/visual system

Purchase new music instruments

Upgrade playgrounds, parking lots and building sign

Improve student safety & security (cameras, phones, lighting, power)

At Middle Schools: improve technology, replace band instruments, improve student safety

At Roseville High School: improve technology, replace band instruments, improve athletics fields, update gymnasium, renovate media center, upgrade planetarium, replace CTE equipment

District Wide: purchase new buses, replace custodial and grounds equipment

If approved by voters, the 2.5 mill bond proposal will cost a person living in a \$90,000 home about 31¢ more per day in property taxes. While some people will pay more, most residents of the school district will pay less than 31¢ per day.

DRESS CODE

Reasonable standards for student dress and personal appearance are essential requirements in the maintenance of an acceptable climate for effective instruction. Extremes in wearing apparel or personal appearance tend to be disruptive to learning and teaching, and such disruption is incompatible with a good learning environment. The great majority of students in Roseville take pride in good appearance. They dress in a manner which reflects favorably upon their school, their class, and themselves.

Prohibited Apparel:

Tank tops/muscle shirts

See-through clothing

Spaghetti straps

Sunglasses

Bare midriff tops

Hats or head gear

Spandex/underwear as outerwear

Flags shall not be worn in a demeaning Inappropriate slogans and emblems manner (i.e. references to alcohol, drugs, low cut shirts or sex)

Exposed undergarments

Pajamas Slippers

***Gang clothing Bandanas *Gang related dress (i.e., emblems) that suggests membership or promotion is prohibited.**

Shorts, skirts, and skorts will not be more than 4 inches above the knee.

Hats, Coats and outerwear should be stored in lockers.

Sagging Pants - Slacks, jeans, shorts, etc. are to be worn at the waist, not hanging low on the hips, or exposing undergarments. Undergarments are defined as any clothing worn under the outer garment.

Shoes – All students are required to wear shoes.

Elementary: All students are required to wear socks and shoes, not slippers or flip flops. Sandals must have heel straps.

Any clothing indecently exposing the person of a student is prohibited.

Any clothing or jewelry in laboratory, vocational, Physical Education class or recess that might endanger the student or other students is prohibited.

Any clothing that is torn or worn indecently exposing themselves or undergarments is prohibited.

Enforcement Whether or not a student is dressed appropriately or properly groomed shall be left to the discretion of the principal or designee. A student whose clothing or apparel violates the dress code will be subject to the code of conduct and must change the inappropriate clothing or be sent home. Exceptions to the dress standards may be designated "Spirit Days" or other exceptions approved by administration. Flexibility may be given for kindergarten, first, and second grades. However, in the cases of an intentional violation of the dress code, a student may be disciplined without the benefit of a prior warning.
