Dear Huron Park Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2015-16 educational progress for Huron Park Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2016-17 year, no new Priority or Focus schools were named; some Priority or Focus schools did exit their status because they met the exit criteria. New Reward schools were identified using school rankings and Beating the Odds information. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap between the highest and lowest achieving 30% of schools. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Reward school is one that has achieved one or more of the following distinctions: top 5% of schools on the Top-to-Bottom School Rankings, top 5% of schools making the greatest gains in achievement (improvement metric), or "Beating the Odds" by outperforming the school's predicted ranking and/or similar schools. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases no label is given.

Our school has been identified as a Focus school.

The key challenges that Huron Park faces are decreasing the achievement gap in reading, writing and science. The key initiatives that we are using to close these gaps are hiring instructional aides, implementation of Corrective Reading program, a K-2 early intervention program, implementation of Reading Mastery walk to read program, implementation of our Connecting Math Concepts (CMC) program, our after-school Moby Max program and our after-school environmental club.

Huron Park Elementary School has a population of over four hundred eighty children consisting of GSRP pre-school and K. through fifth grade students. Students were assigned to Huron Park Elementary School according to their home residence. Families also have the opportunity to apply for a transfer to another school within Roseville Community Schools. In addition Roseville Community Schools participated in the school of choice program throughout Macomb County.

Huron Park has a continuous School Improvement Plan based on state and federal mandates and requirements. Staff members continue to implement strategies identified for the goal areas of reading, writing, social studies, science and math. All staff members were involved in the planning and implementation of this plan. Data from local and state assessments were used to support changes and implement strategies.

The Huron Park staff implemented the core curriculum as provided by the district; this curriculum is regularly reviewed to ensure alignment with the Michigan Curriculum Framework. The curriculum of Huron Park Elementary School is aligned with state standards for instruction. A copy of the district core curriculum is available in the Curriculum Office located at the Administration Building. Parents may call 445-5688 to request a copy.

Each year fall and spring parent teacher conferences are conducted at Huron Park Elementary School. Attendance for conferences in the fall of 2015 was 89% and in the spring of 2016 85%.

Below is a chart detailing the M-STEP results for the 2015-2016 school year. Percentages reflect students who met or exceeded standards. The state of Michigan changed the MEAP Test to the M-STEP test. The new percentages reflect these changes.
