The recent school shooting in Florida has generated numerous “copycat” social media threats across the country, including several in our area of the State. It has also raised student safety and security questions among parents and others residing in our school district.

First, let me assure you that we are very serious about maintaining schools that are safe and secure. Our school district has worked with local law enforcement agencies to develop safety and security procedures. This work continues as we regularly practice and evaluate emergency drills and security protocols.

We also continue to strengthen our safety protocols and procedures in cooperation with the Roseville Police Department. In fact, the Roseville Police Department monitors live feeds from all school district security cameras around the clock.

To enter our schools, visitors must be “buzzed in” from the school office. Our staff members have been diligent in observing student behavior, and our students have learned that they can confidently report suspicious behavior to members of the Roseville staff anytime.

Can we do more? Sure. We have included more safety and security enhancements in our school district’s May 8th bond proposal. If voters approve the proposal, there will be more surveillance measures and more security of our internal doors and exterior entrances.
